Class Schedule: Classes will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday and Sunday. Please make every effort to be prompt, as late arrivals interrupt the flow of instruction. Classes will conclude at 5:15 p.m. on Saturday and at noon on Sunday. A ceilidh will be held Saturday evening; all are welcome. Feel free to bring your instrument or talent and speak to ceilidh coordinator Helen Harlow to schedule a performance time.

SPECIAL CONTESTS:

Piping: "The Gilchrist Challenge." A prize of round-trip air fare from an East Coast U.S. airport to Scotland to compete in the 2012 MacGregor Memorial competition at the Argyllshire Gathering in Oban (the winner must notify the workshop committee of his/her travel arrangements for reimbursement at least 30 days prior to departure date). Competitors must be current EUSPBA members under the age of 22 (as of Aug. 23, 2012), must be registered for the workshop, and must submit four Piobaireachd. (Please submit tunes with entry.) To be held during the daytime Saturday. Highland dress required. First-place prize limited to one consecutive year by the same competitor.

Snare Drumming: "The John Murray Challenge." A prize of tuition for one week at the drumming school of your choice, up to \$500. Competitors must be current EUSPBA members registered in Grade III or IV Snare Drumming, under the age of 22 (as of March 1, 2012), must be registered for the workshop, and must submit one four-part march, two two-part marches or one two-part march played twice, of any time signature, to be played on the drum. To be held during the Saturday evening ceilidh. Competitors are responsible for providing their own piper. Highland dress required. First-place prize limited to one consecutive year by the same competitor.
